

Pupil Premium

2017/2018

The pupil premium is additional funding for schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged children and narrow the gap between themselves and their peers. It is primarily allocated through the number of children entitled to free school meals (not universal infant free schools meals)

In 2017/2018 Edinburgh Primary will receive £229,470 pupil premium funding.

Planned spending of the allocation

Teachers	£90,000
Teaching Assistants	£90,000
Learning Mentors	£40,000
Extra-curricular subsidies	£5,500
Lunchtime Sports Coach	£4,000
Place To Be (part PP funded)	£7,000
Fruit for KS2	£1,750
Booster – Year 6	£12,000

Summary of main barriers faced by eligible pupils at Edinburgh Primary

Children at Edinburgh face a range of barriers to learning. Each child is unique and requires a unique approach. However there are some common themes to barriers experienced by children considered disadvantaged (and may also be experienced by children not considered disadvantaged).

Barrier	How barrier is addressed
Low attainment/poor progress due to gaps in learning	Targeted support from teachers/teaching assistants Additional interventions e.g. Better Reading Support Partners, Numicon, Speech and Language, individualised interventions Year 6 booster
Limited experience outside school and low take up of extracurricular activities	Access to range of trips Access to extra-curricular clubs Lunchtime Sports Coach
Emotional, social and mental health needs which impact on focus/concentration and on behaviour	Learning Mentor Support Place To Be TA support to promote good behaviour/behaviour for learning
Challenging home circumstances (e.g. inadequate/temporary housing, domestic violence, poor nutrition)	Learning Mentor Support for families e.g. referrals, advocacy, liaison with Early Help KS2 free fruit

How impact will be measured

- Termly achievement data includes comparison of achievement of pupil premium/non pupil premium groups
- Pupil Progress Meetings includes a focus on progress of pupil premium children
- Impact of additional interventions includes comparison of progress of pupil premium/non pupil premium children
- End of year data for each year groups is analysed with specific reference to pupil premium/non pupil premium groups
- End of year summary will include comparison of pupil premium/non pupil premium groups.

Review will take place during the year as part of pupil progress meetings and intervention reviews. Annual Review will take place in July 2018.
